

CPCP IMPACTS to NATIONAL PARKS & EXISTING OFFSETS

The CPCP will heavily impact three of the four National Parks lands which currently protect significant areas of Cumberland Plain Woodland.

All three reserves are themselves primary offsets for past developments.

Only one reserve is currently gazetted although all three were to be gazetted by now. Due to the proposed CPCP developments the State Government has stalled the gazettal of one (Shanes Park) in the hope of side-stepping the parliamentary protections which National Parks land attracts. The CPCP proposes clearing within two of these National Parks lands and isolation of all three

The CPCP proposes additions to the National Park estate as offsets for impacts, but not for Cumberland Plain Woodland.
